O R D E R

THIS MOTION is made by the Plaintiff for an order extending the date for the delivery of the respective affidavit of documents or lists of documents, as the case may be for each of the applicable parties, and for an order formalizing case management matters agreed upon by the parties with respect to the discovery process.

ON READING the consents of the parties;

1. THIS COURT ORDERS that each of the parties deliver by no later than November 15, 1996 their respective affidavit of documents or lists of documents, as the case may be.

2. ON CONSENT, THIS COURT ORDERS that:

(a) All parties shall deliver computer disks of their respective lists or affidavit of documents, together with the paper version.

(b) The documents appearing in the respective lists or affidavit of documents shall be available for inspection by other parties to the action, upon the usual arrangements between counsel, commencing the first business day after November 15, 1996.

3. ON CONSENT, THIS COURT ORDERS that the parties may submit to each other and receive answers to relevant written interrogatories without prejudice to further oral examination of each other, and that such questions and answers shall be binding on the respective parties as if asked and given at an oral examination for discovery.


4. ON CONSENT, THIS COURT ORDERS that the following formats shall be followed with respect to written interrogatories:

- (a) In delivering answers to written interrogatories, each party shall list the question followed by the relevant answer given on behalf of the party.

- (b) Where documents are referred to in any written interrogatories, the document shall be given a chronological exhibit number relating to the party being discovered as well as being identified by other means. For example, documents referred to on written interrogatories relating to the defendant Attorney-General of Canada may be referred to and described as Canada discovery exhibit "X", being document "Y" of the defendant Canada's production of documents, a letter of ____ (date) by ____ (person who authored);

- (c) The written interrogatories, and the answers provided in the format described in subparagraph (a) above, shall be submitted by all parties in both paper copy and computer disk formats.
